Plant Pathologist Retires after 29 years with WSU Puyallup and is awarded a life-time achievement award

Dr. Peter Bristow, Associate Scientist in Plant Pathology, has retired after 29 years of researching fungal and viral diseases in berries grown in western Washington. Pete was a coordinator on research projects in Washington, Oregon and British Columbia, and was part of a cranberry research team including scientists from Oregon, Massachusetts, New Jersey, Quebec and British Columbia.

Dr. Bristow received a life-time achievement award at the Pacific Division of the American Phytopathological Society's annual meeting in Portland this summer. This award is given annually to a senior member of the Pacific Division of the APS who has distinguished himself by his contribution to plant pathology and service to the Pacific Division.

A retirement reception was held in the Allmendinger Center for Pete last week with more than 90 colleagues present from Oregon, British Columbia, Mount Vernon, Vancouver, Long Beach, Seattle, Tacoma and Puyallup to recognize him and wish him well.
