Carla Ferguson led a small group of collaborators from Puyallup (Mickey Bean, Jon Newkirk and Tanyalee Erwin) and worked with Nancy Shrope and Pam Kelley from the Office of Grants, Research and Development (OGRD) to plan, construct and run the seminar.

Over 75 people, representing fields from non-profit, university and community organizations, started the morning with Dr. Eric Shulenberger’s three- hour session on strategies to write winning grant proposals, “Deep Strategy and Tactics--- or Brilliance is Not Enough!” In the afternoon, Peter Berliner (Paul Allen Family Foundation), Brad Cheney (Ben B. Cheney Foundation, and Nancy McKay (The Russell Family Foundation) presented a panel discussion on their foundations. They spoke about their experiences and answered questions from the audience.
